

NSS annual report (2025–2026)

1. Blood Donation Camp – July 2025

The NSS Unit organized a Blood Donation Camp in the month of July 2025 with the objective of promoting social responsibility and humanitarian service among students. The camp was conducted in collaboration with a government-approved blood bank and medical team to ensure safe and systematic blood collection. A total of 100 NSS volunteers enthusiastically donated blood, demonstrating their commitment to saving lives and supporting emergency medical needs. The programme created awareness about the importance of regular blood donation and encouraged students to actively participate in such noble causes.

2. Tree Plantation Drive – Academic Year 2025–2026

As part of its commitment to environmental sustainability, the NSS Unit conducted a Tree Plantation Drive on the college campus during the academic year 2025–2026. Nearly 500 saplings were planted by NSS volunteers in various parts of the campus to enhance greenery and promote ecological balance. The initiative aimed to instill environmental consciousness among students and highlight the importance of afforestation in combating climate change and pollution. Volunteers also took responsibility for nurturing and maintaining the saplings to ensure their healthy growth.

3. HIV Awareness Programme – October 22, 2025

On October 22, 2025, the NSS Unit organized an HIV Awareness Programme to educate students about HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment, and stigma reduction. The programme included informative sessions delivered by healthcare professionals who explained the causes, modes of transmission, preventive measures, and the importance of early testing. The awareness session emphasized the need for compassion and support toward individuals living with HIV and encouraged students to adopt healthy and responsible lifestyles. The programme successfully enhanced knowledge and dispelled common myths associated with HIV/AIDS.

4. Health Camp – Ayilpatti Village

The NSS Unit organized a Health Camp in Ayilpatti village as part of its rural outreach initiatives. The camp was conducted with the support of qualified medical practitioners who provided free medical check-ups, consultations, and basic medicines to the villagers. More than 100 beneficiaries

received healthcare services, including general health screenings and medical advice. The initiative aimed to address the healthcare needs of rural communities and create awareness about hygiene, nutrition, and preventive healthcare practices.

5. Seven-Day Special Camp – Mangalapuram Village (January 19, 2026 – January 25, 2026)

The highlight of the academic year was the Seven-Day Special Camp conducted at Mangalapuram village from January 19, 2026 to January 25, 2026. During the camp, NSS volunteers actively engaged in various community development activities such as sanitation drives, awareness programmes, door-to-door surveys, cultural activities, and interactive sessions with villagers. The camp focused on rural development, social awareness, health education, and environmental cleanliness. The special camp provided students with an opportunity to understand rural life, develop leadership qualities, and strengthen their sense of social commitment in alignment with the NSS motto, “Not Me, But You.”
